

## Results for the Rio Grande Cup, for the RG-65 Class

This event was first sailed in 2008. Results shown below are in reverse chronological order.  
All events were sailed in Albuquerque at the Tingley Model Boat Pond

### 2013 Rio Grande Cup for RG65, October 26-27, 2013

Here are the results for the 2013 Rio Grande Cup for RG65. Winds were mostly light, trending to moderate a few times on Saturday, while Sunday saw mostly light and fluky winds. Earl Boebert served as Race Director, with Kathy Bailey serving as scorekeeper. Other Duke City Model Yacht Club (DCMYC) volunteers included Jim Scheibner, Peter Roupas, Judy Boebert and Paul Boucher. Carveth Kramer brought some very nice large banners that showed some color around the pond and gave occasional insight into wind direction and velocity.

The results shown below were from alternating groups of odd/even finishes, with reseeding after our Saturday lunch break, and again before racing began on Sunday. Reseeding was done by grouping the top half of the fleet in the first grouping, and second half of the fleet in the second grouping. After the initial two groups sailed, we continued with odd/even finish groupings. Cells with no horizontal lines represent the group that raced first, and cells with horizontal lines represent the group that raced second (if you do not see horizontal lines in half the cells, try a different pdf viewer). Shaded cells are discarded scores.

The column labeled “# Next” is the number of times a competitor raced against the next competitor in the final race results. For instance, 5 for Eric Rosenbaum means Eric raced against Gary Boell 5 times, then Gary raced against Hap McGill 4 times, and so on. DNS = Max Number of boats in a group + 1 = 13.

Three RG65 boats sailed in a stock Dragon Force configuration. One sailed with stock sails, while the other two had aftermarket sails sized to match the stock A-sail rig. When ranked within the overall results, Richard Ball had the best finishes, followed by Allen Buzzell and then Tony Solo.

Trophies were awarded for finish places first through fourth, and by popular vote, the competitors awarded our Victor Rotolo Sportsmanship Trophy to Chandler Hill.

In order to evaluate how well our modified odd/even heat system worked, we summarized the matchups between the first five finishers. The first column is the matchup between finish positions, the middle column is the number of times they met head-to-head, and the third column is the number of times the higher finisher beat the second skipper.

Pete Eschman served as Race Director, with very able help from Paul Boucher, Peter Roupas, and Jim Scheibner who served as race committee. Kathy Bailey was our hard working scorekeeper, and helped organize the event lunches and dinner on Saturday. Once again, Earl Boebert helped publicize the event and also arraigned for chevrons and very nice trophies. Jay Eschenberg was our photographer and videographer, rescue tugs were run by Peter Roupas and Kieth Radcliffe. Peter's rescue tug also served as a GoPro video camera platform with Jay and Peter as camera boat operators. We would like to thank all skippers and their spouses for pitching in to help with this event.

We have included optional details on RG-65s sailed, including hull type (BI Sp = Blue Splash), rig type (SI = Sloop, Sw = Conventional Swing), keel fin depth (bottom of hull to bottom of bulb in mm), and all-up boat weight in grams. Following International RG-65 convention, skippers were allowed one "boat" per day of our event, where one "boat" is defined as one hull, one fin, one bulb, one rudder, and three sets of class legal sails. One skipper changed his "boat" from Saturday (IACC) to Sunday (MK Rush).

Earl Boebert offered this event summary: The first annual Rio Grande Cup was held in Albuquerque in light, shifty and puffy conditions the weekend of 17-19 October 2008. Despite all our efforts, the economic conditions and uncertainty limited participation to the six RG65s in the Duke City MYC. We had a great time, and now that we have one event under our collective belts we're ready for next year's Cup.

Six boats competed in the bright New Mexico sun, four ABQ 65 hulls and two JIF 65s. The conditions really tested the skippers' skills and the RGs showed their ability to move in a whisper of a breeze throughout the two days of sailing. In particular, their quick acceleration in a puff turns downwind legs, usually fairly dull parades, into something exciting. You can be half a dozen boat lengths behind and then ride the leading edge of the tiniest puff right back into contention.

Our thanks to Rebecca Houtman of the Albuquerque Bio Park for all her help in setting up the venue and publicizing the event locally, and Sven Stau who donated two Askook hulls, both of which were won by members who do not yet have an RG, so our fleet will grow by at least two.
