Four Soling skippers sailed in oscillating light wind conditions, using marks in the southern half of the pond. Starting south, we rounded to starboard for the SE yellow, S Orange and then back north to finish. After the first three heats we made it two laps by rounding the near white starting mark to starboard then back south to yellow, orange and then finish. The two-lap course allowed for lead changes and position swaps.

My transmitter quit just after the start of the first heat, and once I got new batteries installed, it was too late to finish the course. All four batteries showed full on the charger the night before so I think one of my rechargeable batteries must have failed and I will need to do some serious battery testing.

We did take time to rescue a small electric motorboat, much to the joy of the young boy who owned it, and one of the adults in their group made it a point to come over and thank us. It turned out this was a dress rehearsal for rescuing the Soling that Peter Wilson was sailing when it experienced control problems at the end of the day.

All the rescue time added up, so we quit around 3:30 after sailing 6 heats. We had fun!

Three Soling skippers sailed in oscillating light wind conditions, using the northern half of the pond, which let us take advantage of the shade from the trees near the storage box. Starting north, the first three heats were sailed with port roundings to the center orange, NW green and finish. The remaining seven heats included a port rounding of the western white mark, followed by a second lap using the first two marks of the course and then south to finish. Points for second place were in play right up to the last heat, and we all had fun.

During the first heat Peter Roupas' boat encountered a submerged object that stopped the boat dead in the water. Three weeks earlier, when Peter Wilson and I practiced raced, I had encountered the same object, so I think we have a persistent submerged hazard in the area to the NW of the eastern white start/finish mark. We did our best to choose a race course that avoided this area for the rest of the day. I'm guessing this object may be a wayward air supply hose for the northernmost pond aerator, given that the object has been stationary for about the last month.

He also saved the day when he rescued the score sheet which blew into the pond and was usable after careful unfolding and drying.

We started the first heat in little to no wind. In fact, the wind conditions on Saturday were some of the worst we have seen, and there were more than a few too many birds on the pond. The winds improved as the day progressed, with at least some breeze for most of the later heats.

All eight heats were half lap. The first heat started north, then starboard rounding of the NW green, N center orange and then finish. Remaining heats were started heading south, with port rounding on the SW green and S center orange, then north to finish. Later, the BioPark curator stopped by to discuss placement of a new algae control device. The device will be similar to the old one, but using newer technology. It will be anchored to the bottom and suspended in the water column beneath a surface float. It may end up being located south of our starting marks, and north of the southern marks.
